While the staff and volunteers of the WRC never ceased services throughout the pandemic, some of our other rituals and practices were paused or overshadowed by the urgent need to prioritize health and wellness while providing those on-site, in-person, and safety-centered services to victims of sexual and domestic violence. Our large group in-person outreach efforts, newsletters, and donor events are just now beginning to re-emerge as this very season is seeing the return of many signs of normalcy. Fortunately, we have held relationship and community with you for 45 years and so our supporters granted us that pivot inward; we are looking forward to reconnecting with you through our calendar of upcoming outreach events, volunteer opportunities, and various donations drives. How we connect you with our mission is limited only by our imaginations!

As we look up from this critical work of advocacy for sexual and domestic violence survivors, we look forward to connecting more with you. Indeed, without you we could not do this work. While we serve over 3,000 people each year, we could not do it without the over 3,000 individuals who support our mission through the donation of time, talents, and resources. That the number of people we serve and the number of partners in this work is so similar is not lost on us; it is a reminder of the solidarity of our community around the WRC's mission and vision.

Each day, our staff and volunteers answer the 45-year old 24/7 hotline and provide advocacy. Each week, we participate in community outreach efforts. Each year, we will invite you to participate in awareness, stewardship, and fundraising events. This fall, we are hopeful that you'll join us for an evening of celebration on October 6th as we honor the first forty-five years of advocacy in the New River Valley.

As we move beyond the first 45 years, we hope you will join us for a Candlelight Vigil in October. We must remind ourselves and our neighbors that in the midst of so many things we can disagree over, we stand united in the belief that everyone deserves to be safe from sexual and domestic violence.
